House of Salt and Sorrows by Erin A Craig

This book is a deliciously creepy retelling of The Twelve Dancing Princesses, full of ghosts, gods, and sparkling ballrooms. The book is set in a fantasy past. The main character, Annaleigh, is the sixth daughter out of twelve sisters who live in a mansion by the sea. Four of the sisters have already died at the start of the book, and although the deaths are put down to accidents, Annaleigh suspects foul play - while others talk of a curse. As she gets sucked into a world of darkness and magic, she realises that she can't trust anyone, not even herself, because behind the glittering gowns and painted masks something sinister is at play.
