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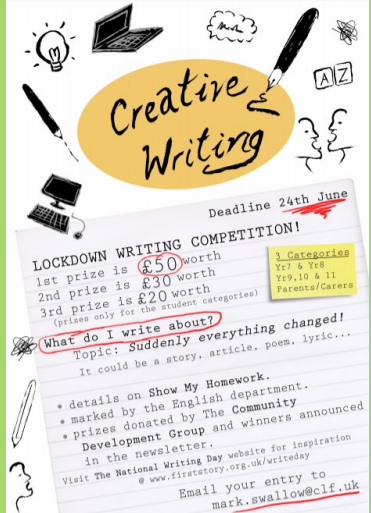

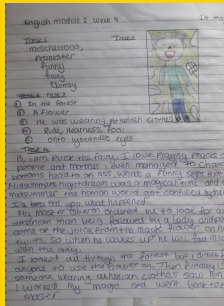
Challenge: 6 marks exam question:

Describe how carbon atoms from the atmosphere are cycled through a food chain. (6)

Green plants take in CO₂ from the atmosphere and carry out photosynthesis. The CO₂ is used to make carbohydrates, fats and proteins. Eating passes carbon compounds in plants to the primary consumers of a food chain. The primary consumers will then be eaten by the secondary consumer, passing the carbon compounds in the primary consumer to them, and so on through the food chain. Plants and animals respire while they live, releasing CO₂ back to the atmosphere. Plants and animals eventually die and decompose. When they are broken down by microorganisms, these respire and release CO₂ back to the atmosphere.


